

Good Spots and key species

Barmah Forest

~ Superb Parrot; robins in winter at Murrays Mill; White-backed Swallow at Baxter's Pit; Blue-faced Honeyeater at Barmah Town; Dollarbird; water birds on Barmah Lake; yellow form of Crimson Rosella.

Deniliquin

~ waders in summer; Intermediate Egrets at Island Sanctuary; Blue Bonnets to the north.

Echuca-Moama

~ Water birds in lakes opposite the entrance to Rich River Golf Club; Rainbow Bee-eaters at Echuca Cemetery in summer

Gulpa Island

~ Southern Whiteface; Brown Tree-creeper, Diamond Firetail and Emus along Sages Road; White-browed Babbler on Langmans Sandhill; ducks and Swamp Harrier at Reed Beds; Nankeen Night Heron and White-browed Scrubwren at Picnic Point.

Gunbower Island

~ Bush Stone Curlew; ducks in lagoons.

Kamarooka Forest

~ White-eared, Tawny-crowned, Fuscous, Yellow-plumed, Purple-gaped, White-fronted and other Honeyeaters

Kanyapella

~ Singing Honeyeater along O'Dea Road; Grey-crowned Babbler near Wakiti church.

Perricoota Road

~ Western Gerygone, Varied Sittella and Brown Tree-creeper at the Five Mile; Grey-crowned Babbler at the Ten Mile; Diamond Firetail alongside the wetland opposite Perricoota woolshed.

Terrick Terrick National Park

~ Australian Ringneck, Diamond Firetail and Gilberts Whistler in forested area; Plains Wanderer and Richards Pipit on grassland.
