


Avian Crossword ~ Australian inland birds

 82 Dollar Bird is the only Australian species of these robust colourful birds which all have large heads, short hooked bills and small feet and which live mainly on insects caught in flight and in the outer foliage of trees. (7)
 84 Sharp, bony projection on bend of wing (e.g of Masked Lapwing) or on legs (4)
 87 Reliance on integrity (e.g. of an bird observer who claims to have located a rare bird) (4)
 88 Explorer after whom a desert national park, an inland mountain and a stony desert are named. (5)
 91 down Jewelled species of dove sometimes abundant in outback areas following good rains but uncommon in northern Victoria (7)
 94 Amphibian, food for a heron or spoonbill (4)
 95 Frozen balls of precipitation (4)

 99 Flightless Australian bird (3)
 100 and 96 down Darker than 92 across but still uncommon raptor
 102 Can we track this water bird by train? (4)
 103 Birds may do this on a very hot day; some raptors wear a pair of them (4)
